



The walk detailed below right is best followed using Ordnance Survey Explorer Map OL 41 'Forest of Bowland and Ribblesdale'. It takes approximately 11/2 hours to complete and is mostly easy walking over fields grazed by sheep and cattle with several stiles - some of them steep. Robust footwear or Wellingtons are advisable.


