


Base yourself in the bustling market town of Clitheroe for an active weekend of picturesque rides and scenic walks – including a challenging hike to the top of iconic Pendle Hill. And once you've burned a few hundred calories on foot or in the saddle, you'll find plenty of places to replace them in the most enjoyable way!



This two-day itinerary starts amid the rugged limestone coastline of Silverdale and explores the woodland and nature reserves of the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty whilst winding its way south over the gnarly outcrop of Warton Crag to Carnforth Station



of Bowland AONB. The line links the iconic Lancashire seaside resort of Morecambe with the West Yorkshire city of Leeds, connecting villages and towns along the Wenning Valley between Wennington and the edge of the Yorkshire Dales at Giggleswick. The market town of Bentham is at the heart of the local farming community, and it makes an ideal base for exploring the epic walks and rides this undiscovered corner of England has to offer.



This two-day itinerary starts in the market town of Clitheroe, which is renowned for its bustling market, specialist retailers and Bowland Food Hall – a showcase for the best Lancashire produce. After a morning in town and a delicious lunch, we head out west for a foraged supper before visiting a series of artisan food and drink producers on Day 2.
